New Jersey State Nursing Association Region 6 Beulah Eglantine Miller Scholarship for Nursing Education

Policy on Granting Scholarship Awards

Purpose:

To provide financial assistance to New Jersey State Nurses Association members and/or New Jersey Nursing Students who reside in Region 6, in order to enhance and promote completion of an educational program/degree in Nursing.

Board Guidelines:

- 1. Awards will be granted to nursing students enrolled in an Entry-level, RN-to BSN, MSN, or Doctorate program.
- 2. Current membership in Region 6 is required, except for entry-level students, who must reside in Region 6. Region 6 membership must be active for the entire current calendar year.
- 3. A nursing student may only receive an award once per level of educational program.
- 4. The NJSNA Region 6 Treasurer will provide a financial report to the NJSNA Region 6 Executive Board. This report shall identify potential monies available for scholarship awards.
- 5. The NJSNA Region 6 Board of Directors will make a decision annually as to the number of scholarships and the amount of the awards taking into consideration the treasurer's report.
- 6. The Region 6 Director for Education and Scholarship shall serve as the Chairperson of the Region 6 Scholarship Committee. In addition to the chairperson, the NJSNA Region 6 Scholarship Committee will be composed of a minimum of two members of the NJSNA Region 6 Board of Directors. The President of NJSNA Region 6 shall act as an ex-officio member of the scholarship committee assisting with any policy questions that might arise.
- 7. It shall be the responsibility of the Scholarship Committee to review the applications and make determinations with regard to the recipients and amount of the individual awards.
- 8. The scholarship recipients will be invited to the Annual General Membership Meeting as the guest of Region 6 to celebrate the award.
- 9. Scholarship recipients are expected to engage in Region 6 activities in the year subsequent to their award, or subsequent to licensure if the recipient is an entry-level student. Suggested activities include participating on the Nominating or Scholarship committees, providing support to a county chairperson, or presenting a topic at an upcoming meeting.

Application Process:

- 1. An application for the NJSNA Region 6 Scholarship will be available on the NJSNA Region 6 microsite or may be obtained by contacting the NJSNA Region 6 Director for Education and Scholarship. Contact information will be available on the NJSNA Region 6 microsite.
- 2. Applications must be produced via a word processing program and emailed to the NJSNA Region 6 Director for Education and Scholarship.
- 3. The deadline for scholarship applications is October 15. All applications must be submitted to the Scholarship Committee Chairperson by October 15 of each year in order to receive consideration.
- 4. Awarding of scholarships shall be made on the basis of grade point average and the quality of the application. Financial need may be considered should the need be documented, providing all other application requirements have been met.
- 5. If an applicant is known to a scholarship committee member, the committee member will recuse themselves from making a decision on the specific applicant's application.
- 6. The Scholarship Committee will make its decision on or before November 15.
- 7. The Scholarship Committee Chairperson shall notify all applicants via email as to whether an award has been granted, of the decision of award recipients, and no later than November 20.
- 8. The Scholarship Committee Chairperson shall provide the Region 6 Treasurer with the Name, School Name, School Address, and Student ID #, of all applicants who have been awarded a scholarship, no later than November 20.
- 9. For each awarded applicant, the Region 6 Treasurer shall disburse the scholarship funds directly to the bursar of the school the awarded applicant is attending no later than November 30.
